She works closely with businessess, charities, agencies and low income communities to help them activate low carbon living, working and learning.

She is also spearheading the development of the National Fruiting Forest, a network of orchards and fruit groves linking city to countryside and providing free food for all.

She lives in the Nottingham ecohome with her husband Gil Schalom and their daughter Jasmine. Their home was the UK's first radical eco-retrofit of a Victorian villa and has been hailed as a pioneering project of national significance.

Penney is patron of and trustee of a number of green charities which no doubt explains why Archant London have chosen her to host this year's event.
