



Greenpeace has been working with coastal fishermen for a reform of the EU Common Fisheries Policy (CFP)



Our fish and our fishermen are in trouble

- * The CFP has been introduced to ensure profitable and sustainable fishing
- * But it's threatening our fish and our local fishermen.
- * This year, we have a once in a decade opportunity to fix it.
- * But we can't do it without you.



Why are the fishing laws broken?

- * More than 70% of the world fish stocks are overexploited and depleted
- * 62% of fish stocks are overfished in the Atlantic and 82% in the Mediterranean
- * The EU's combined catch is the third largest in the world
- * The EU fleet is capable of catching 2-3 times more fish than the ocean can handle
- If overfishing continues at the same intensity, we risk the collapse of all fish species in 50 years



Why are the fishing laws broken?

- * The current system favours the most destructive parts of the fishing industry. Many boats using high—impact methods of fishing have been awarded quota and have received billions in taxpayer subsidies
- * European vessels have the right to fish in developing countries where destructive operations are threatening the lives of millions of local fishermen which depend on fishing for food and income
- * Meanwhile, small-scale fishermen are being shut out, even though most of them fish sustainably.



The UK Fleet

Under 10 metres


Over 10 metres





Under 10 meter boats

- •They represent **77**% of the UK fleet but they only have **4**% of the fishing quota
- •The majority of these boats use sustainable methods of catching fish
- •Small-scale fleet also contributes **65**% of full time employment at sea
- •Importance for coastal communities
- •They are competing against UK and EU industrial vessels



The Cornelis Vrolijk



- * UK largest vessel
- * Overfishing in West Africa
- * In only one day this boat can catch what 56 local boats would catch in the whole year
- * Very little fish left to catch for local fishermen
- * Threatening the livelihoods of local fishing communities

Alliance with fishermen

Greenpeace, NUTFA and other UK Fishermen's Associations and fishermen have signed a joint declaration on the reform of the Common Fisheries Policy August 2012



Manifesto for fair fisheries Joint declaration between Greenpeace, NUTFA, UK Fishermen's Associations and fishermen on the reform of the EU Common Fisheries Policy.

We, the undersigned organisations (Greenpeace UK, the New Under Ten Fishermen's Association (NUTFA), and various UK Fishing Associations), make the following declaration:

The EU Common Fisheries Policy (CFP) has not worked and is not working for fish, fishermen, the marine environment, coastal communities, or consumers. The system is broken and the 2012 reform process is our best, last chance to fix it.

The CFP favours the most influential parts of the European fishing industry, often those operating with the highest environmental impact and least benefit to society. Meanwhile, responsible fishermen, who use sustainable methods, are in real danger of losing their livelihoods. The CFP currently threatens the future of our fish, our fishermen and the coastal communities that rely on them. The UK's maritime heritage is at stake.


