FUTURE FRIENDLY 2011 AREA WINNERS

- ★ **Anglia winner:**
Growing Spaces (Cambridge) - a programme to create 30 new community and public gardens and food-growing spaces in Cambridge over three years.
- ★ **Border and Tyne Tees winner:**
Dig Deep to Help Us Grow (Middlesbrough) - provides the Probation Service with donated seeds plants and tools to grow produce on their allotment for sale in charity shops.
- ★ **Central winner:**
Derrington - Way Ahead! (Stafford) - a community-led project which aims to promote more sustainable lifestyles and increase awareness of climate change among local villagers.
- ★ **Granada winner:**
Four Groves Community Association (Cumbria) - volunteer-run youth groups, employment search, community allotments and recycling projects for the LGBT community and people with disabilities.
- ★ **London winner:**
Whale of a Time (London) - organises creative workshops on environmental issues with the aim to connect the community with nature and wildlife.
- ★ **Northern Ireland winner:**
Killymoon Community Group (County Tyrone) - a group of environmentally friendly members who are passionate about making their small community the cleanest and greenest in the Cookstown area.
- ★ **Republic of Ireland winner:**
Shanahanagh Community Garden (Dublin) - organises and supports the community to manage its own community garden on previously misused land where anti-social behaviour was prevalent.
- ★ **Scotland winner:**
Greener Kirkcaldy (Fife) - helps people reduce their fuel bills and go greener, working through their advice centre, home visits, workshops and community groups events.
- ★ **South winner:**
Action for the River Kennet (Marlborough) - shows children how amazing their local river is by helping them care for brown trout - from eggs to baby fish to release into the wild.
- ★ **Wales winner:**
Maes y Pant Action Group - MyPAG (Wrexham) - raised £76,000 and purchased a 70-acre redundant quarry to encourage and protect wildlife and as a recreation area for the community.
- ★ **West and West Country winner:**
Eco-Logic (Cornwall) - a re-use and recycling project which exchanges household goods for voluntary community work such as cleaning beaches, picking litter and repairing community areas.
- ★ **Yorkshire winner:**
Ecobusters (Goole) - a group of staff and students who have created a sustainable garden, encouraged creativity in sustainable lessons and taken part in eco projects in the community.

THE HERO AWARDS – NOW CLOSED

Individuals, as well as groups, can make all the difference with their actions. So this year, for the first time, we're launching awards for individual heroes.
